The Free Agents defeated Schroeder's of Brainerd in the "if" game, 10-5. 1st National Bank/Goodfella's, of Little Falls, upended the Lady Silverback's of St. Paul, for 3rd place honors. Hanson/C.J.'s of the Chisago County league beat Pine Brook Inn in the Consolation Championship. The Minnesota Aces of Red Lake/Bemidji won the "Team Sportsmanship Award". Kayla Webster, of the Free Agents, was named Tournament MVP.

In the Men's Division, the Minnesota Outkast defeated C.J.'s, of Almelund/Palmdale, 26-14 in the Championship game. Thompson Construction of Princeton finished 3rd, and the Red Lake Bombers of Red Lake/Bemidji, finished 4th. We would like your team to enter, and remember, ENTER EARLY, so when teams inquire, we can tell them, "We have teams!"
